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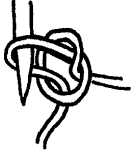
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Knitted Cast-On (K-CO)

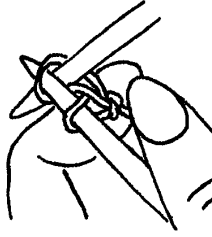
Why this way of casting on?

- *Because the loops are easy to pick up and knit in.*
- *Because it is VERY elastic and does not get tight*
- *Because you can cast on wherever you want. Just pick up any loop you want and use it as a start-stitch for casting on.*

Make a slip knot as usual and place it on a needle held in your left hand.



With the free needle in your right hand knit into the slip knot and place the new st twisted onto the left needle (= 2 sts).



Again knit into the new st and place the 3rd st twisted onto the left needle. Repeat the last step until you have the necessary number of stitches.
